
BOYS SOCCER

That's one helluva kick sonny, one helluva kick. JR Dan gets ready to boot the ball into the next dimension.





"Aauuuggghhh." Because he isn't the largest guy on the team, Marcus Tschopp finds another way to intimidate the opposition.



GOLF




GIRLS VOLLEYBALL
































Wow! Catch the excitement. Watch TSN. Okay, so our junior girls didn't make it to the World Championships but as this picture shows, they can play an exciting game.



Look at that monster spike!!! Christine Onyschtschuck delivers a power spike right down the oppositions' throat.




