# JR. GIRLS BASKETBALL

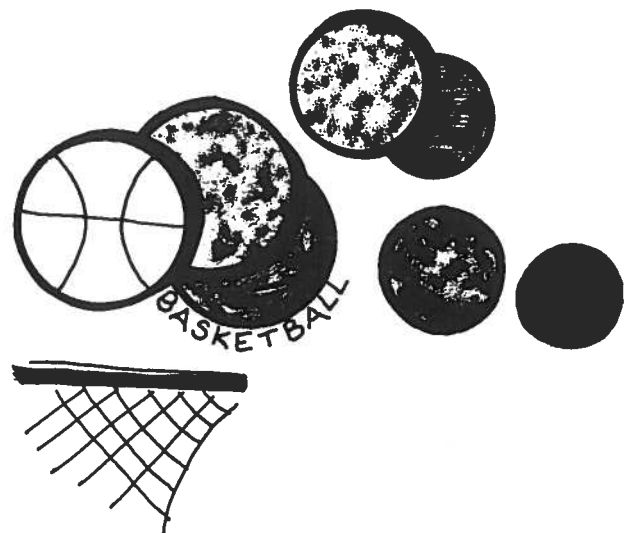
