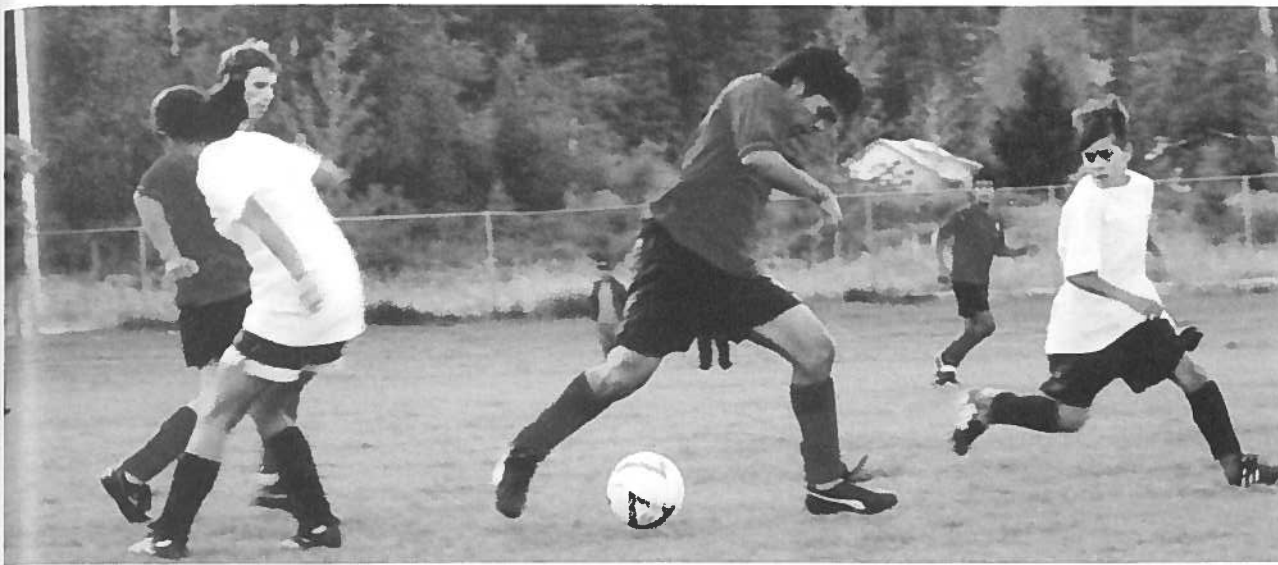

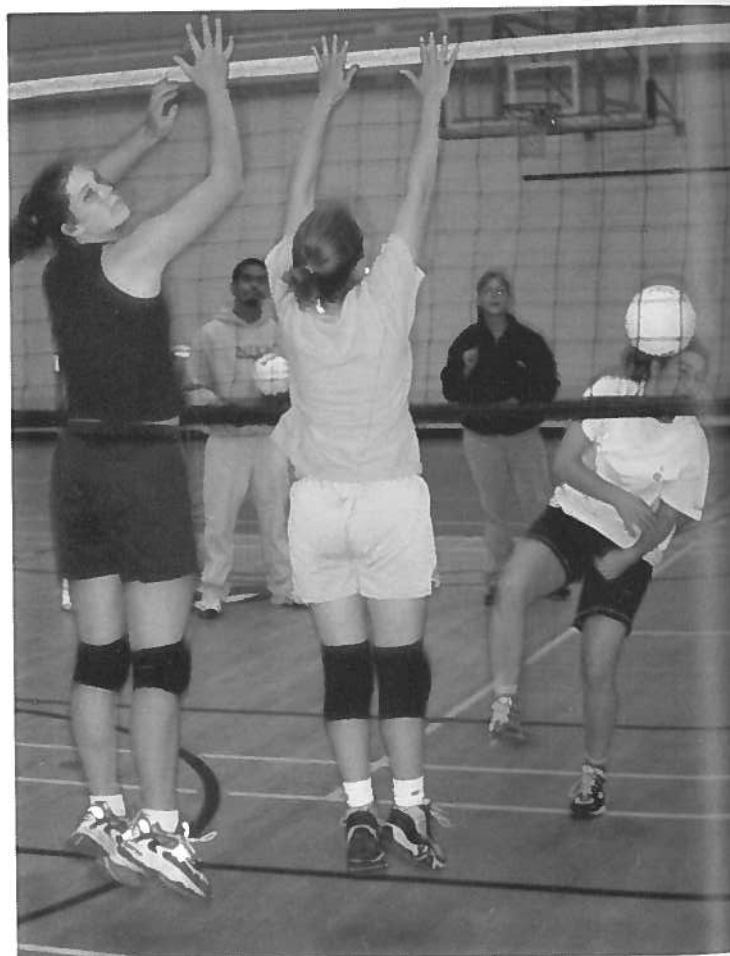

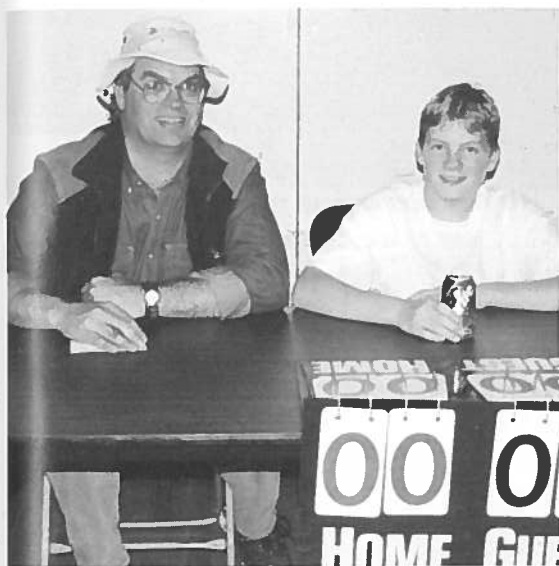

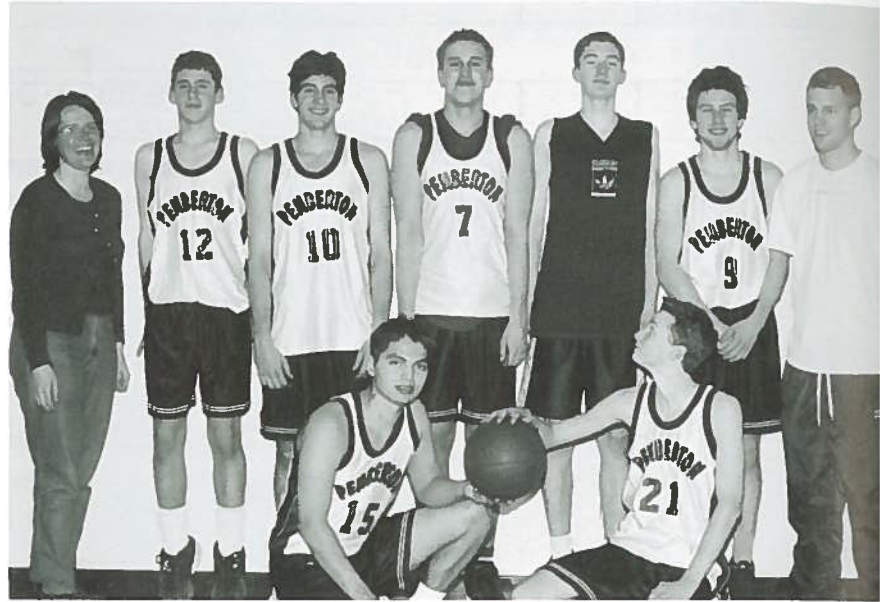
Susanna Kurne fights for a rebound during the Provincial Championships.

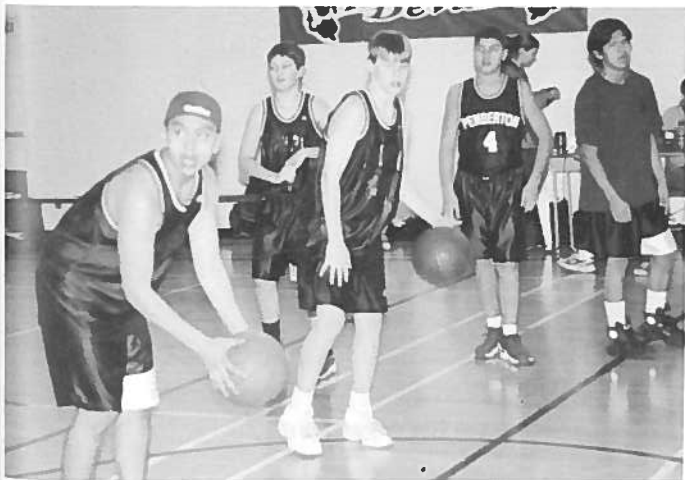

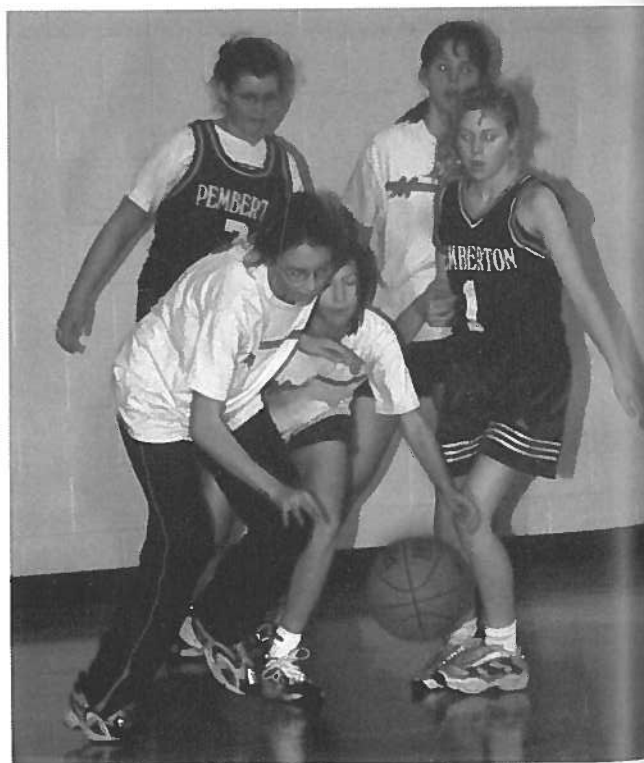
